

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR & CFO

This past year has been a time of transition on so many levels. As a community, we are transitioning out of COVID-19 lockdowns and living with the new reality that outbreaks will continue to happen. As an organization, we are in a state of transition, after growing our innovative programs and services by more than 40% over the past two years. While these transitions may initially feel challenging, we hope you see it as we do - as an opportunity to embrace transition in order to continue to collectively evolve, grow and build our organization, and ultimately, the mental health of our community.

In the face of this transition, we've added new services to meet the needs of youth through Foundry Wellness on Wheels, added additional Supportive Housing units for people experiencing homelessness, and focused on the prevention of homelessness through the Central Okanagan Rent Bank. We've stepped in and stepped up to support where needed during the pandemic, including adapting our services to allow for virtual access, expanding our outreach programming to ensure that those that are living without homes in our community have access to relational and material supports, and connection to resources that can end their experience of homelessness. We've offered virtual counselling services, so those that are experiencing daily stressors, exacerbated by the pandemic, have easy access to free counselling services. We have focused our energy on prevention and early intervention services through the launch of Discovery College, with an array of courses co-created and co-facilitated by professionals and people with lived experience.

At the heart and soul of our organization, and one of the things that makes us most proud about CMHA Kelowna, is our people. Our team of committed and dedicated professionals have thrived in the face of so many new and ongoing challenges, and make the impossible seem possible every single day. Our Board of Directors contributes to our success through their leadership, vision, strategic thinking, and support. The success of CMHA Kelowna relies on this behind the scenes team and their inspiring vision for a mentally healthy community.











Expenses




Program & Services (90% of our Expenses)
